

Pastoral Letter for June

This following is an unpaid, unsolicited church political advisement.

This June, The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod will hold its triennial Presidential election. Carol English and I will be casting votes electronically. Our incumbent President, The Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison, will be eligible for reelection for a fourth term. There are other candidates on the ballot as well. Although it is a secret ballot, I will tell you that I am voting for President Harrison.

I have met President Harrison on a few occasions. One occasion was especially memorable for me. President Harrison was a guest at our District Convention. At events such as that, Presidents and other dignitaries rarely get a moment of peace and quiet. At meals, coffee breaks, or whatever, they are usually mobbed by people bending their ears, telling them what they ought to do. That day, I was late getting in the lunch line, and was then sitting all alone eating by myself. President Harrison came over and sat down with me.

We had a pleasant, casual conversation. He could have told me all about the great things he had done as President and what his plans are for the Synod's future. Instead, he asked me about myself, my family, and my congregation. He shared some personal information about himself with me too. We laughed a lot. Our conversation went from the proverbial "ridiculous to the sublime."

That he was so sincerely interested in a nobody like me made a big impression on me. And it doesn't hurt that his perspectives on the church and theology are very much like mine, that is, traditional, confessional, biblical. Matthew Harrison is a man I trust. The nicest thing that I can say about another pastor is "He is someone I would want to be my pastor." The President is the pastor to pastors. I want Rev. Harrison to be my pastor and President.

Please pray for our Synod and President Harrison or whomever is elected. God bless the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS for MAY

The May 22nd regular Council had an excellent attendance with Cathy, Linda, Alice, Dick, Rich, Marvin, and Pastor present. Business was short, simple, and easily done.

The financial picture is fairly stable. Investments increased in value by \$2000 to a total of \$255,551.84. The treasury, General Account, shows a slight deficit; however, a second transfer of \$5000 for this current year from Investments has eased cash flow concerns. Offering income is averaging approximately \$2569 a week. \$3600/week is needed for a balanced budget.

Upon recommendation of the Stewardship Board and subsequent Council discussion, disbursement of Memorials from Christmas '22 and Easter '23 was approved. \$500 from each will go to Lutheran World Relief, Salvation Army, United Way, Lutheran Braille Workers, Pioneer on the Lake (formerly Camp Pioneer). An additional \$500 will go to the Eastern District once a specific purpose is determined.

Ordering of 2024 Offering envelopes was approved. 75 boxed sets of envelopes will cost \$273 plus shipping.

Several properties' projects have been completed – much to Marvin's pleasure. Shea's has done a really good and speedy job for

several issues, the total cost of multiple issues came in under budget. Completed projects include: repair of heating system for lounge and front-end areas, servicing of roof-top air conditioning units, routine boiler maintenance (necessary to maintain warranty), leaks in in the janitor's closet, replacement of the original 1970s sump pump in the boiler room.

Repair of a leak in the kitchen garbage disposal is in progress. Trimming of the neighbor's three trees is scheduled to be done very soon. These "dirty" trees have continual falling needles and branches upon the church roof and have caused clogged drains which have led to leaks in the interior ceiling areas and

replacement of many ceiling tiles. This Properties list of needed repairs and replacements is finally "under control" and with conservative use of the budget.

The next Council meeting is June 26, 6pm. Guests are always welcome.
